5 Themâu Trawsbynciol

Defnyddia'r ysgol y Fframwaith Llythrennedd, Rhifedd a Chymhwysedd Digidol wrth gynllunio.

Mae'r Fframwaithiau yn nodi'r disgwyliadau ar gyfer y Camau Cynnydd o ran llythrennedd, rhifedd a chymhwysedd digidol ar gyfer pob dysgwr. Trwy ddefnyddio'r fframwaithiau, rydym yn sicrhau bod cyfleoedd o fewn cynlluniau gwaith ar gyfer disgyblion o bob ystod gallu, i ddatblygu eu sgiliau llythrennedd, rhifedd a chymhwysedd digidol mewn pob maes dysgu a phrofiad yn drawsgwricwlaidd.

Anghenion Dysgu Ychwanegol yr Ysgol (ADY):

Nod yr ysgol yw adnabod disgyblion yn gynnar er mwyn darparu'r ddarpariaeth orau a mwyaf cynhwysfawr, gan eu cynorthwyo i gyrraedd eu llawn botensial.

Ceir trefniadau gan yr ysgol i adnabod a darparu ar gyfer ADY disgyblion. Os oes pryder ynghylch disgybl, caiff Proffil un tudalen ei baratoi gyda targedau penodol, dyddiadau adolygu a syniadau i rieni ynghylch sut i gefnogi eu plentyn gartref. Os caiff y posibilrwydd bod gan ddisgybl ADY ei ddwyn i sylw'r ysgol a gynhelir, neu os bydd hyn yn ymddangos iddo fel arall, rhaid i'r ysgol benderfynu a oes gan y disgybl ADY. Mae'r Ysgol gyda'r disgybl, teulu a phawb sy'n ymwneud â'r plentyn yn rhan o'r broses Ymholiad ADY.

Dilynir y broses Ymholiad ADY yn unol â gofynion amserlen a osodir gan y Cod Anghenion Dysgu Ychwanegol Cymru 2021.

Os penderfynir bod gan blentyn ADY sy'n galw am ddarpariaeth ddysgu ychwanegol (DDdY), bydd gofyn i'r ysgol (neu weithiau'r awdurdod lleol) baratoi a chynnal Cynllun Datblygu Unigol (CDU) ar gyfer y plentyn. Mae **ddarpariaeth ddysgu ychwanegol (DDdY)** yn ymyrraeth sydd yn ychwanegol i'r hyn sydd yn digwydd fel rhan o gwricwlwm gwahaniaethol arferol yr ysgol.

Mae "cynllun datblygu unigol" neu "CDU" yn ddogfen sy'n cynnwys:

- (a) disgrifiad o ADY person;
- (b) disgrifiad o'r ddarpariaeth ddysgu ychwanegol y mae anhawster dysgu neu anabledd y person yn galw amdani;
- (c) unrhyw beth arall sy'n ofynnol neu sydd wedi ei awdurdodi gan neu o dan Ran 2 o'r Ddeddf ADY.

Cyd-gysylltydd ADY Ysgol y Faenol yw Mrs Manon Jones a Mrs Sian Jones yw'r llywodraethwr dynodedig ar gyfer ADY. Gweler adroddiad ar gyfarfodydd llywodraethwyr am fanylion pellach ynghylch aelodau ADY yn ystod y flwyddyn. Mae copi o'r polisi ADY ar gael yn yr ysgol.

Disgyblion Anabl:

Mae gan ddisgyblion anabl fynediad llawn yn yr ysgol, gyda pholisiau clir a chadarn i sicrhau nad oes gwahaniaethu yn eu herbyn. Mae'r ysgol wedi ymrwymo i greu amgylchedd cynhwysol, gan gynnwys darpariaethau megis pedwar toiled hygrych wedi'u lleoli'n strategol ledled yr ysgol. Yn ogystal, mae rampiau wedi'u gosod i hwyluso mynediad i bob dosbarth, gan sicrhau bod yr holl gyfleusterau'n hygrych i bawb.

16. Cyfrwng Iaith

Mae'n ysgol ddwyieithog.

17. Defnydd o'r Gymraeg

Mae'r ysgol wedi ei dynodi yn 'Ysgol Cyfrwng Gymraeg' yn unol â pholisi iaith yr AALL. Mae'r ysgol yn gweithredu'r polisi iaith o fewn y Cwricwlwm i Gymru. Amcan y Polisi Iaith yw datblygu gallu pob disgybl fel ei fod yn hyderus yn y ddwy iaith erbyn diwedd Bl6 fel y dânt yn aelodau llawn o'u cymuned ddwyieithog.

Addysg Dosbarth Meithrin/Derbyn

Sicrhau, trwy ddarpariaeth a threfniadaeth bwrpasol a sensitif, y caiff pob plentyn sylfaen gadarn yn y Gymraeg er mwyn dod yn hollol ddwyieithog maes o law. Ble mae'r Saesneg yw'r famiaith, caiff ei pharchu a'i gwarchod.

Blwyddyn 1 a 2

Adeiladu ar y sylfeini ar gyfer y Gymraeg trwy gyfrwng addysg dosbarth meithrin a dosbarth derbyn. Cadarnhau a datblygu mamiaith plentyn sy'n dysgu Gymraeg a bod y plentyn o gartref ble siaredir y Gymraeg yn cael gwell gafael ar Saesneg. Atgyfnerthu a datblygu Gymraeg a Saesneg plentyn sy'n siarad mamiaith arall.

BI 3-6

Atgyfnerthu a datblygu Cymraeg a Saesneg pob disgybl yn eu holl agweddau goddefol a gweithredol, er mwyn sicrhau y gall siarad, darllen ac ysgrifennu'r ddwy iaith yn rhugl ac yn hyderus wrth drosglwyddo i'r ysgol uwchradd. Gwneir trefniadau ar gyfer hwyrddyfodiaid yn CA2 fynychu Uned Iaith Dalgylch(Maesincla) ble ceir cyfleusterau i gyflwyno cyrsiau dwys arbenigol ar gyfer dysgwyr. Bydd y dysgwyr yn trosglwyddo'n ol i'r ysgol gynradd o fewn tymor.

Siarter Iaith Gymraeg

Caiff amcan y Siarter iaith ei hyrwyddo gennym er mwyn:

Rhoi arweiniad o ran cynnydd defnydd disgyblion o'r Gymraeg yn gymdeithasol. Yn ystod y flwyddyn, buom yn gweithio tuag at sicrhau'r wobr arian. Bu'r Cyngor Ysgol yn cynllunio ac yn trefnu wythnos lwyddiannus yn dathlu'r iaith Gymraeg a'n diwylliant.

18. Toiledau'r Ysgol

Mae'r rhain yn doiledau wedi eu hadeiladu'n bwrpasol, yn cynnwys toiledau 'bychain' yn y Meithrin a Derbyn. Ceir toiledau ar wahan ar gyfer bechgyn a genethod yn o BI 1 i BI 6.

Mae toiledau'r staff wedi'u lleoli ar goridor canolog yr ysgol, gan sicrhau mynediad hawdd i'r holl staff. Yn ogystal, mae pedwar toiled hygyrch ar gael ar draws yr ysgol, gyda thoiledau penodol ar gyfer staff ac ymwelwyr wedi'u lleoli ger y brif fynedfa.

Mae'r toiledau'n cael eu glanhau'n ddyddiol i gynnal safonau hylendid uchel, ac mae unrhyw faterion cynnal a chadw yn cael eu datrys ar unwaith er mwyn sicrhau cyfleusterau diogel a glân i bawb.

A school curriculum is everything that a learner experiences in the school. In designing the curriculum of Ysgol y Faenol the needs of our learners are at the forefront of our minds. We give detailed consideration to what we teach, how we teach it and also why we teach it. Teachers use various teaching methods to present and teach the work in order to meet the needs of all pupils as far as possible. Various methods are used include active learning, peer learning, problem solving, developing cross-curricular skills, outdoor learning and learning through play. We also use assessment for learning and Pie Corbett's philosophy.

Developing Cross-curricular Skills

5 Cross-cutting themes

The school uses the Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Competence Framework when planning.

The Frameworks clearly note the expectations for the Progress Steps in terms of literacy, numeracy and digital competency for every learner. By using the frameworks, we ensure that there are opportunities within the work plans for pupils of all abilities to develop their literacy and numeracy and digital competency skills in all subjects across the areas of learning and experience across the curriculum.

The School's Additional Learning Needs (ALN):

The school aims towards early identification of children to provide the best and most comprehensive provision and help them to reach their full potential.

The school has arrangements to identify and make provision for ALN pupils. If there is concern regarding a pupil, a One-Page Profile is prepared, with specific targets, review dates and ideas for parents about how they can support their child at home. If the potential that a pupil has ALN is brought to the attention of the maintained school, or if this becomes apparent in a different manner, the school must determine whether the pupil has ALN. The School, together with the pupil, the family and everyone involved with the child is part of the ALN Enquiry process.

The ALN Enquiry process is followed in accordance with the time-scale requirements set by the Additional Learning Needs (Wales) Code 2021.

If it is determined that a child has ALN that calls for additional learning provision (ALP), the school (or sometimes the local authority) is required to prepare and maintain an Individual Development Plan (IDP) for the child. The **Additional Learning Provision (ALP)** is an intervention that is additional to that provided as part of the school's usual differentiated curriculum.

An "individual development plan" or "IDP" is a document that includes:

- (a) a description of the person's ALN;
- (b) a description of the additional learning provision required by the person's learning difficulty or disability;
- (c) anything else that is required or has been authorised by or under Section 2 of the ALN Act.

Ysgol y Faenol's ALN Co-ordinator is Mrs Manon Jones, and Mrs Sian Jones is the designated governor for ALN. Please see the report on the governors' meetings that provides further details about the ALN members during the year. A copy of the ALN policy is available at the school.

Disabled Pupils:

Disabled pupils have full access to the school, with clear and robust policies to ensure that there is no discrimination against them. The school is committed to creating an inclusive environment, including provisions such as four accessible toilets located strategically throughout the school. In addition, ramps have been installed to facilitate access to every class, ensuring that all the facilities are accessible to all.

16. Language Medium

It is a bilingual school.

17. Use of the Welsh Language

The school is designated as a 'Welsh Medium School' in accordance with the LEA language policy. The school operates the language policy within the National Curriculum. The aim of the Language Policy is to develop the ability of all pupils to be confident in both languages by the end of Y2, so that they become full members of our bilingual community.

Nursery/Reception Education

To ensure, through purposeful and sensitive provision and organisation, that all children are given a firm grounding in Welsh to enable them to become fully bilingual in due course. Where English is the mother tongue, it will be respected and protected.

Years 1 and 2

Build on the foundations laid for the Welsh language through nursery and reception class education. Consolidate and develop the mother tongue of children who are Welsh learners and, in the case of children from Welsh-speaking homes, extend their grasp of English. Reinforce and develop the Welsh and English of children who speak another mother tongue.

Yrs 3-6

Consolidate and develop each child's Welsh and English in all their passive and active aspects, in order to ensure that they can speak, read and write fluently and confidently in both languages when they transfer to secondary school. Arrangements are made for latecomers to KS2 to attend the Catchment Language Unit (Maesincla) where there are facilities to provide intensive specialist courses for learners. Learners will transfer back to the primary school within a term.

Welsh Language Charter

We promote the objective of the language Charter, to:

Provide guidance on increasing pupils' social use of the Welsh language. During the year we have been working towards the silver award. The School Council planned and arranged a successful week to celebrate the Welsh Language and our Culture.

18. School Toilets

These are purpose-built toilets, and include 'small' toilets in Nursery and Reception. There are separate toilets for boys and girls from Y1 to Y6.

Staff toilets are located on the school's central corridor, ensuring easy access to all staff. In addition, there are four accessible toilets available throughout the school, with specific toilets for staff and visitors located near the main entrance.

The toilets are cleaned daily to maintain high hygiene standards, and any maintenance matters are resolved immediately to ensure safe and clean facilities for all.

19. Healthy Eating

As a result of our work to promote healthy eating, step 5 of the Healthy Schools scheme was awarded to the school.
